### GOALS & INTERESTS

### CONSIDER COSTS



University is expensive. In addition to the cost of your tuition, if you attend a university that's far from home, then you'll need to factor in other costs, such as accommodation, transport, food, data and general living expenses.

Consider looking for various financial aid options, as well as any bursaries or scholarships offered, before starting your studies. These could assist in offsetting the costs of your studies and other related expenses.

You'll spend at least three years at your university, so think about the type of place you want to live in – whether it's a big, busy city with a diverse student body or a quieter, smaller campus with a more tight-knit community atmosphere.

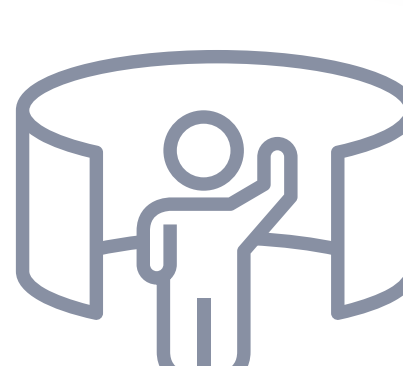
Find a support network to help you make the most of your university life, so that you can reach your full potential. From learning and development to counselling and health services, it's important to choose a university that you feel will support you.
